2. Innovative Interfaces Updates and New Products

Tim Whisenant of Innovative Interfaces presented Betsy Graham's presentation from the IUG Conference. (Ms. Graham is the Vice President of Product Management at III). Mr. Whisenant also discussed features of Encore, the new CS Direct layout, and the conference's opening session with Dr. Michael B. Johnson of Pixar Animation Studios. He also answered specific questions from the participants:

- Millennium's turnkey servers are IBM servers (Red Hat Enterprise Linux)
- He squelched any rumors that III was for sale. It is not for sale nor is there any plan to sell it in the future. III is a strong company that is still growing.
- WebBridge is not split into two parts (Pathfinder Pro / WebBridge Link Resolver)
